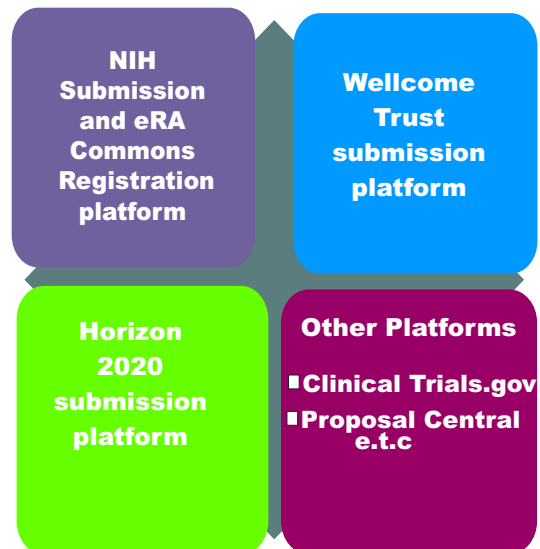

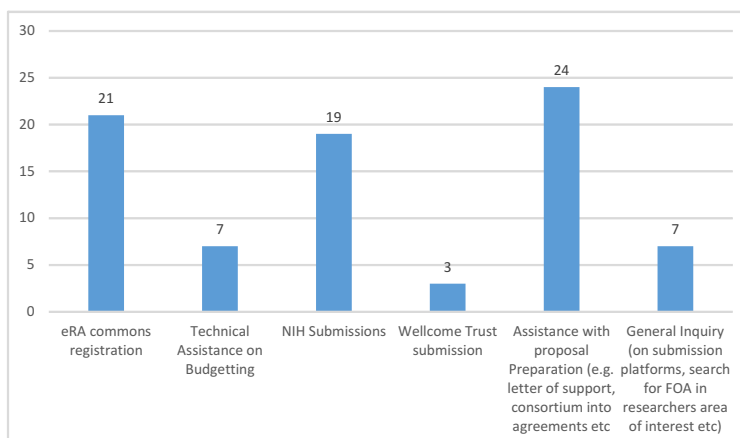

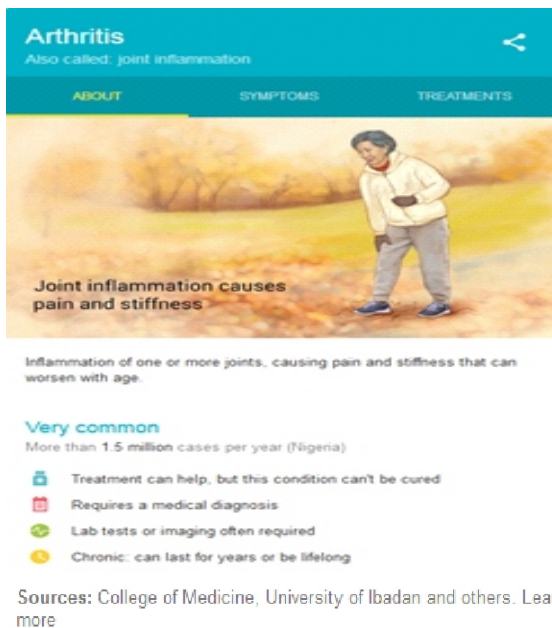

iRESEARCH 2017

The annual “College Research Day” was initially planned as a three-day event but had to be compressed to a one-day event due to the industrial strike action of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU). Dignitaries from the College of Medicine, University College Hospital, University of Ibadan, and two guest speakers from institutions in the United State of America graced the event.

The theme for the event was “Creating spaces for diverse partnership”. The event was held on Wednesday 13, September, 2017 at the Emeritus Professor Theophilus Oladipo Ogunlesi Multipurpose hall opp. UCH. In attendance were 106 academic staff, 74 students and 108 non-academic staff; making a total of 288 attendees.

Two guest lectures were presented in two sessions. The first session was chaired by the Provost, College of Medicine, Professor. E.O. Olapade-Olaopa (who was represented by the Deputy Provost). The guest lecturer for the first session was Professor Collins Airhihenbuwa the funder and CEO of U-RISE, LLC and former Dean and Professor at St Louis University, United States of America. The topic of his lecture was “Leadership and Culture in the Age of I”.

In between the first and second sessions, Dr. Kemi Amodu gave a presentation on the bio-repository (planning phase) that CRIM is currently working on.

The second session was chaired by the CMD of UCH, Prof. Alonge. The guest speaker was Prof. Olugbenga Ogedegbe, from Department of Population Health at New York University, Langone Medical Center, United States of America, who spoke on “Collaborative Research Partnership in sub-Saharan Africa: Exemplar from Cardiovascular Research Training program.”
